- Because this could be dangerous.

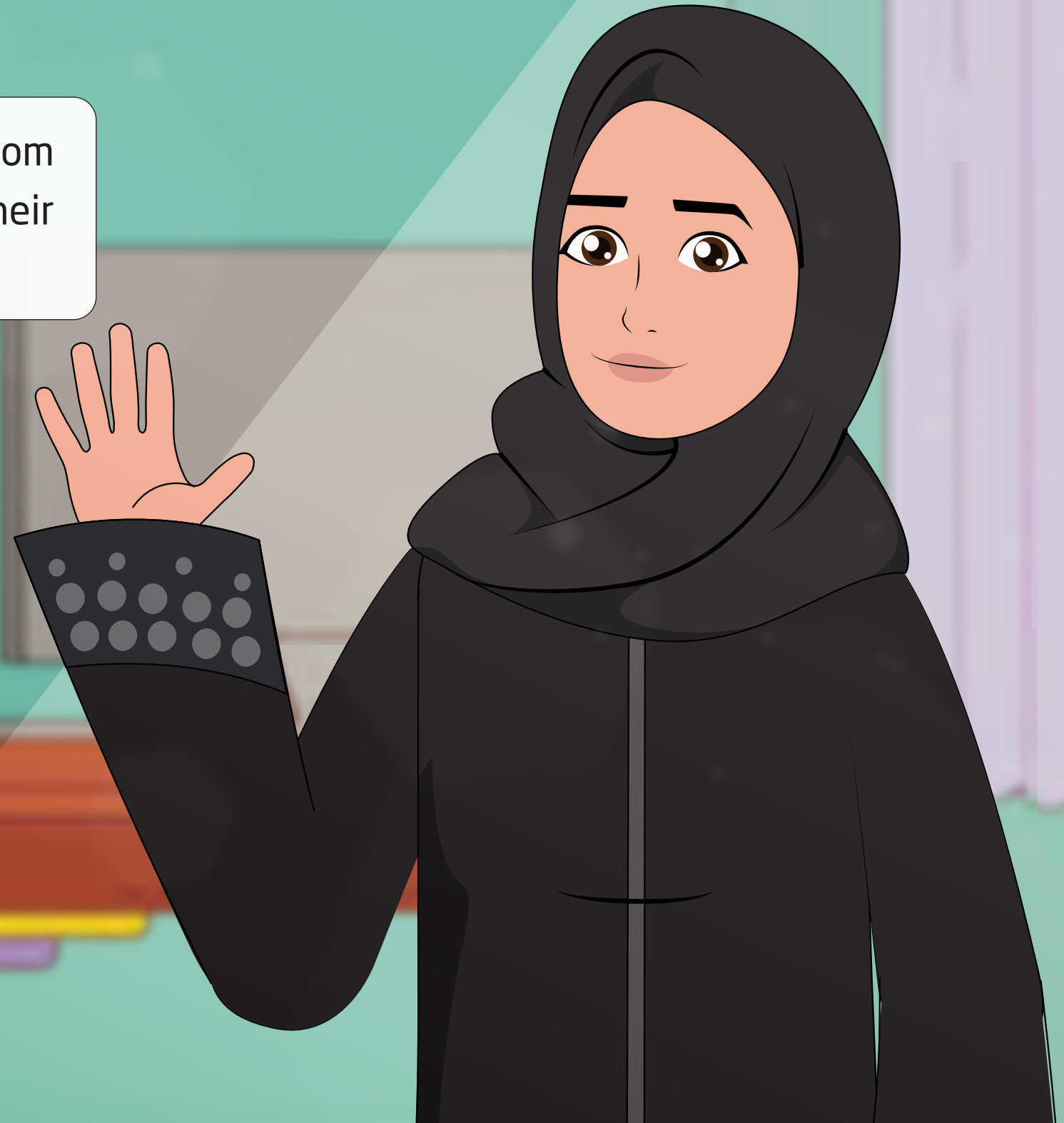


Jasim laughed with a loud voice and said:

- But it's a known source. It's a toy store.

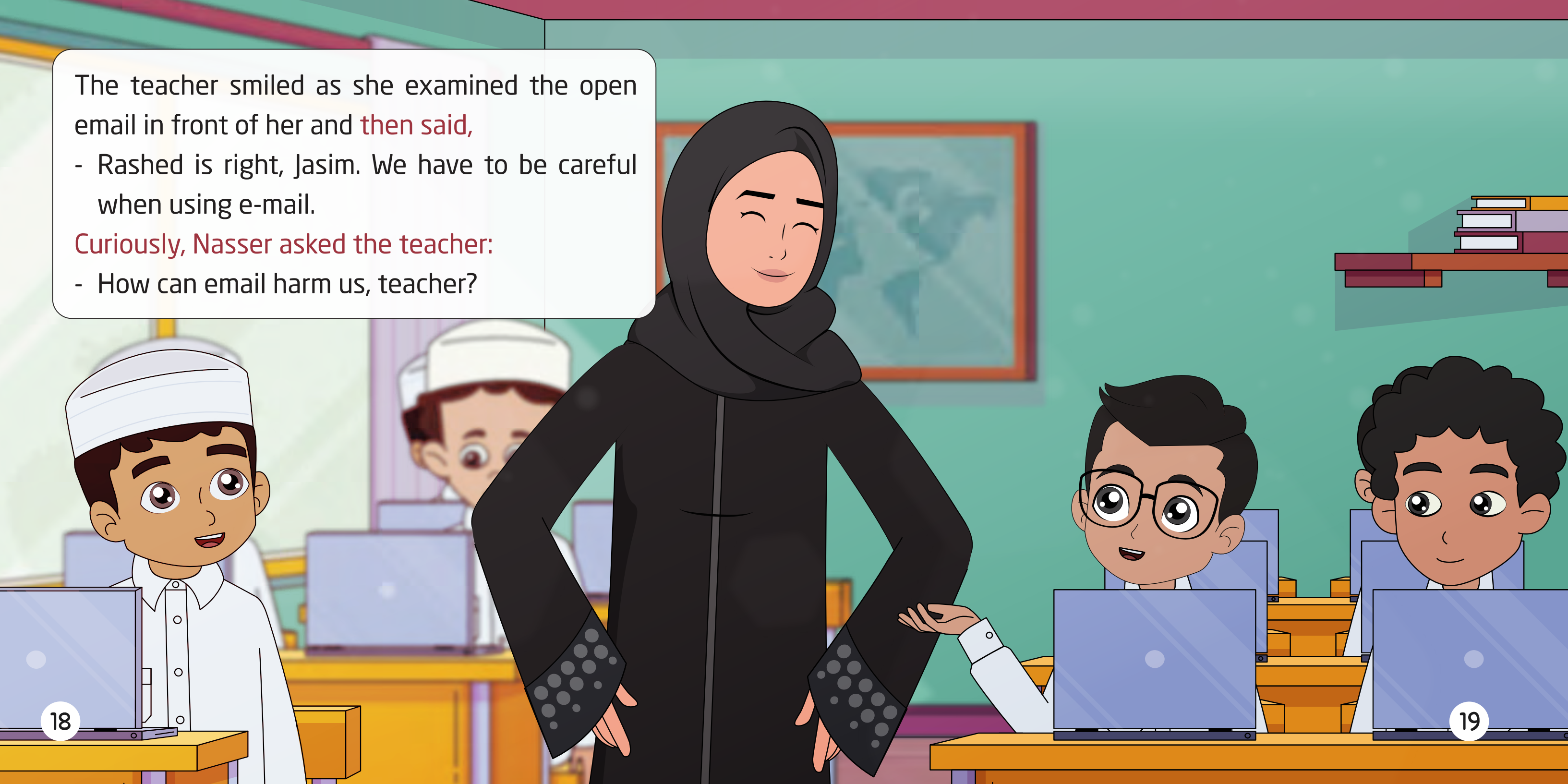


The teacher smiled as she examined the open email in front of her and **then said,**

- We need to create a strong, hard-to-guess password. We should protect our email passwords as if they were precious treasures. Also, enabling two-factor authentication, if possible.

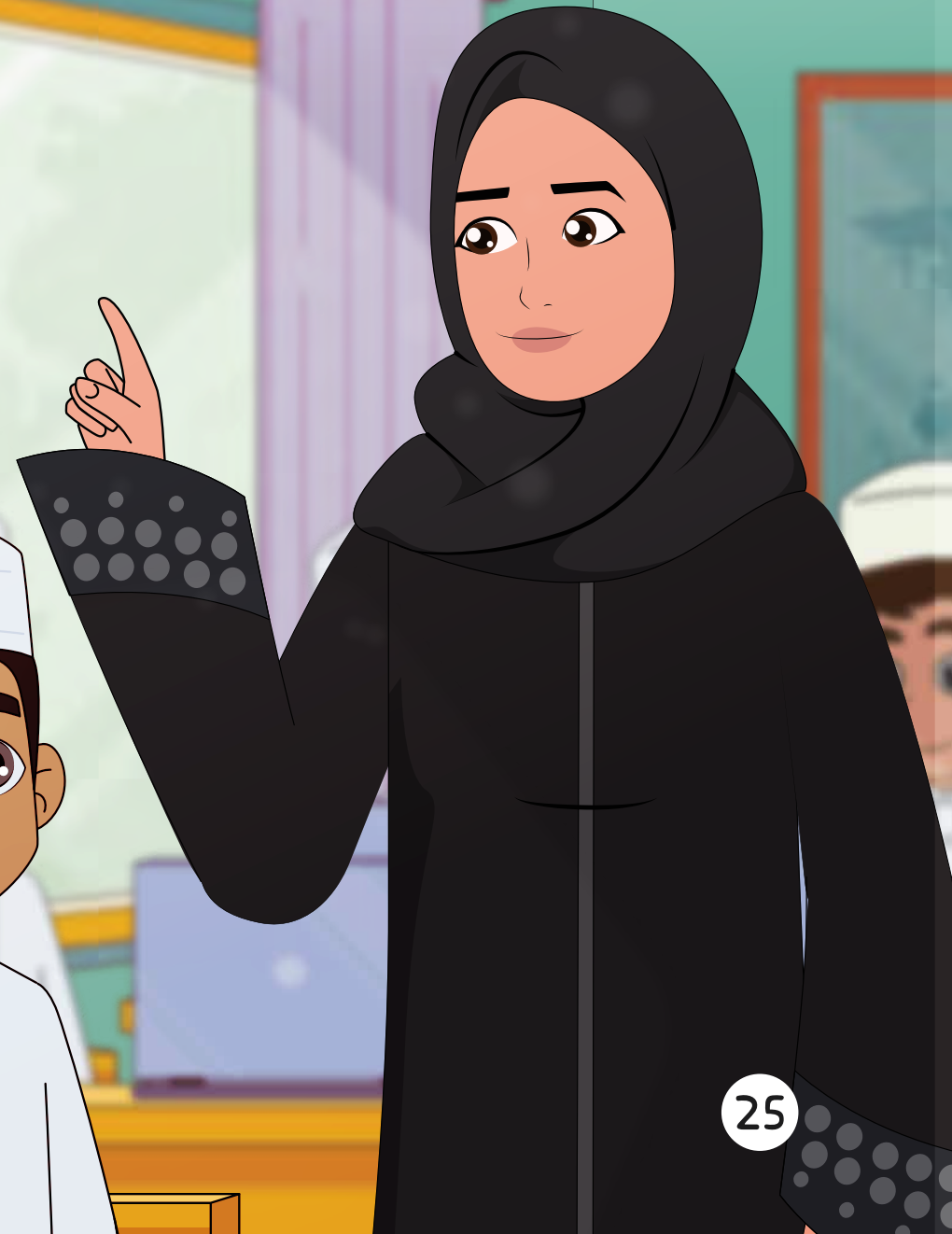
Jasim asked:

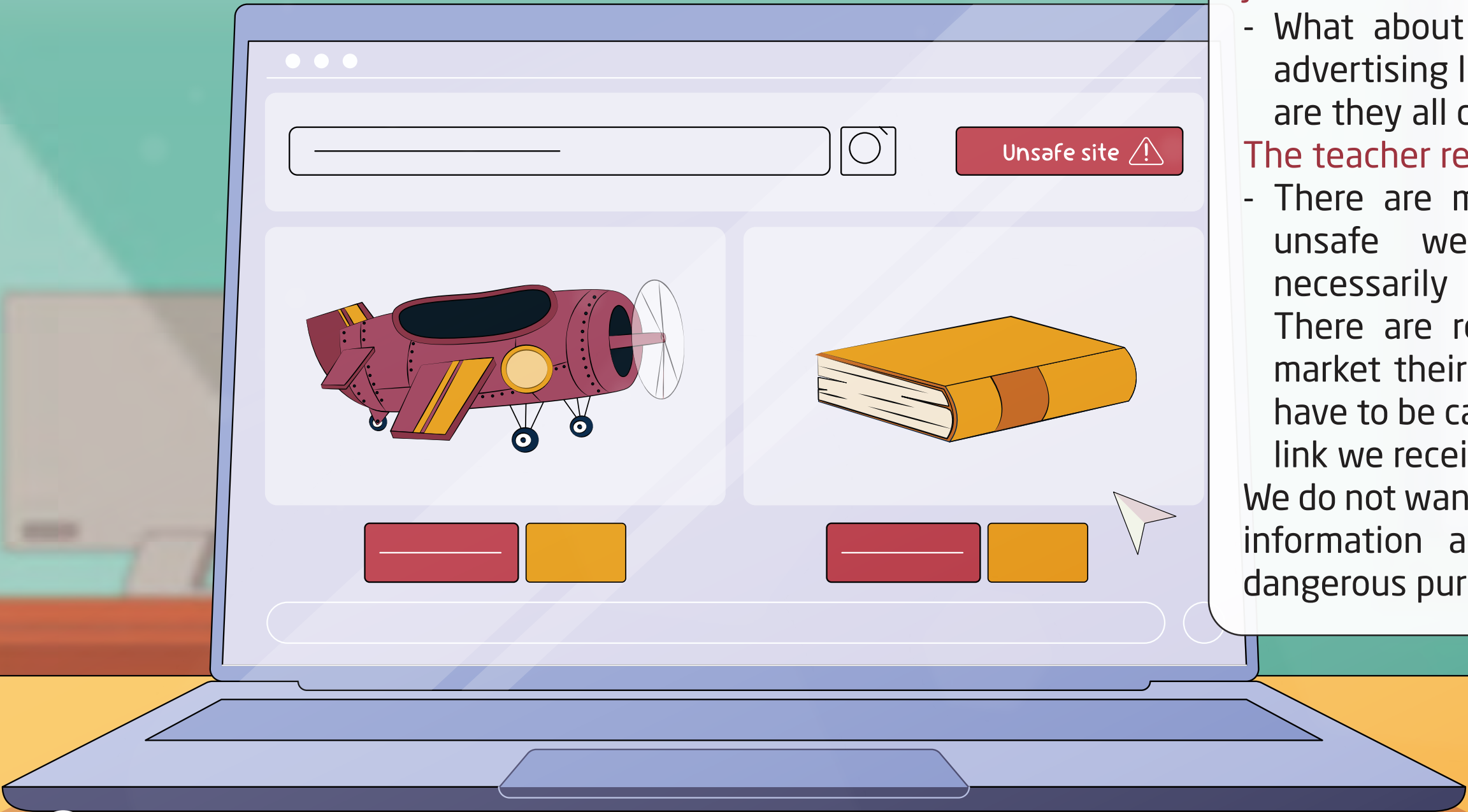
- How do we do that?

Ok, my friend, I agree.

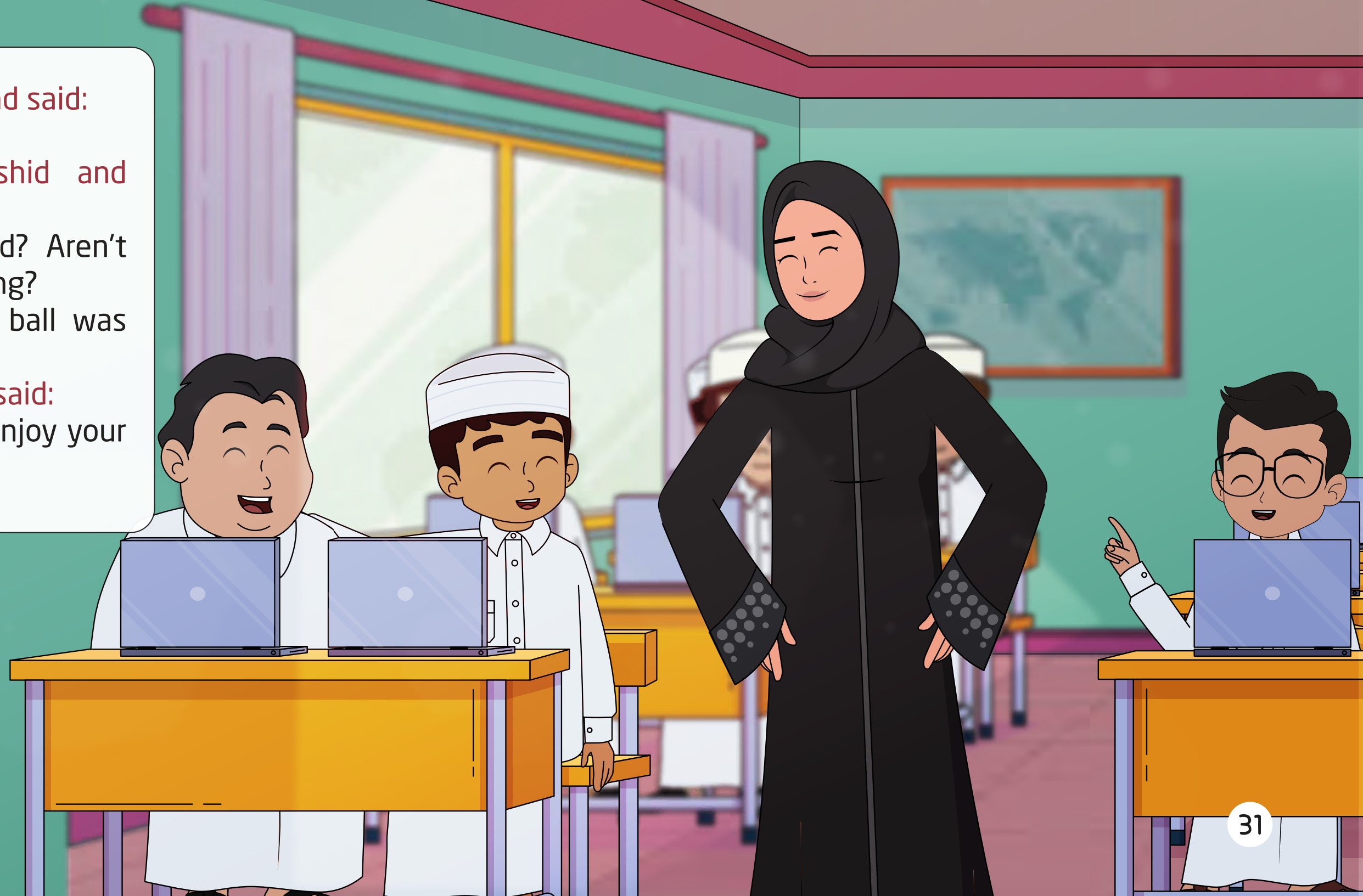
Nasser looked at Rashid and asked him:
