How do I protect my computer?






Jasim: A polite child in primary school, beloved, and has a sense of humor.



Nasser: A smart and talented child in primary school, curious and fond of pets.








The teacher: A thirty-year-old young man, known for his gentle approach and academic proficiency, loved by his students.






- What are you doing, Nasser?

The teacher replied:


 Because strangers might use this information to harm us.

The teacher replied:


- Ensure security settings for your email and privacy settings for your social media accounts


Rashid said:

The teacher replied:



The teacher replied:




Jasim humorously replied,
